

Massimo Zaurrini

editor in chief of InfoAfrica/Africa e Affari

Born in 1973, Massimo Zaurrini started to work as a journalist at the age of 19, during the University. His passion is always been Foreign Affairs, starting with covering Latin America for Italian and international media from Mexico City, where he lived until 2000. Back to Italy he was a junior researcher and analyst at Ce.Mi.S.S. and then, from 2002 to 2012, worked for an international press agency, dealing mainly with Africa. He collaborates with various Italian and international newspapers, both as a journalist and as a columnist with radio and television. In 2012 he founded Internationalia Srl, the only Italian publishing house entirely dedicated to Africa. With its products (daily InfoAfrica, monthly Africa e Affari and bi-monthly Africa Rivista), Internationalia brings

to Italian Institutions (MoFA, Bank of Italy, CDP, Sace, ICE, etc...), Academic, Business Community and readers a punctual political and economic information about what's happening in Africa. Since 2015 he is a member of the

Central Committee of the Center for Relations with Africa (CRA) of the Italian Geographic Society (SGI).

With Infinito Edizioni he has published two books dedicated to Africa: Savané. Soldier girls in Ivory Coast (2006) and Radio and machete. The role of the media in the 1994 genocide in Rwanda (2012). Actually, with Gianfranco Belgrano, is working on a new book "Africa; the Continent of the Future".

Massimo Zaurrini is at the moment editor in chief of InfoAfrica (information and consultancy service dedicated to economic and political developments in Africa) and Africa e Affari (monthly dedicated to African economy and politics).
