## Task Description and Skill

**Profile Title:** Policy and External Relations Advisor, P (3), Subject Matter Expert

**Department/Office:** Triangular Partnership Programme/Support Partnerships Service/Division of Special Activities/ Department of Operational Support

### Framework:

The United Nations Triangular Partnership Programme (TPP) is a peacekeeping capacity-building programme under the Support Partnerships Service (SPS) of the Division for Special Activities (DSA), Department of Operational Support (DOS). It was launched in 2015 as a result of the 2014 Leaders' Summit on United Nations (UN) Peacekeeping. Initially focused on engineering training in East Africa, it has expanded into a comprehensive programme with four projects: three training projects focused on engineering, medical, and C4ISR, and one operational support project on telemedicine.

Through its pillars of work, the TPP aims to enhance peacekeepers' capacity in engineering, medical and C4ISR & camp security technologies through the provision of training and operational support. As trained troops are better equipped to deliver high value and priority requirements, they also improve the Organisation's ability to operate more effectively on the ground. TPP also provides a framework for improving operational support with new initiatives like telemedicine. It also contributes to the implementation of Action for Peacekeeping (A4P) and A4P Plus (A4P+).

Over its decade-long experience, the TPP has progressively widened in scope to keep pace with the increasingly complex challenges faced by UN Peacekeeping and African Union (AU) Peace Support Operations (PSOs), to ensure the Programme can continue to close required capability gaps. Such efforts have included enhancing its training offering to mainstream Counter-Improvised Explosive Device (C-IED) considerations, as well as developing e-learning courses such as the recently launched 'Environmental Management

Best Practices for Environmental Stewardship in UN Peace Operations'. Nevertheless, as both UN and AU peace operations increase in complexity, new areas of work such as alignment with the women, peace and security agenda, and more robust monitoring and evaluation, impact assessment and enhanced communication with stakeholders are necessary.

Additionally, while the recent Peacekeeping Ministerial in Berlin confirmed that multi-lateral training partnerships such as the TPP are essential to the future of effective peace operations, peacekeeping at large has been called to be more nimble, agile and cost-effective.

### **Core Projects and Initiatives:**

The subject matter expert (SME) "Policy and External Relations Advisor" will work closely with members of the UN TPP core team at UNHQ and UNON (Nairobi, Kenya) and will be working transversely with all stakeholders of the UN TPP within the UN and Member States to actively contribute to the enhanced visibility and impact of the TPP.

Depending on the individual's profile, engagement with external TPP stakeholders such as regional training centres, supporting Member States and donors, and UN missions may be required. The successful candidate will consider best practiced approaches and adequately capture Member States' perspectives coming through the UN TPP collaborations.

### **Organizational Setting and Reporting:**

This position will be hosted at the Triangular Partnership Programme, Support Partnerships Service (SPS), Division for Special Activities, Department of Operational Support. For day-to-day operations, the Policy and External Relations Advisor reports to the Senior Programme Manager of TPP.

### **Responsibilities:**

The expert will have the following main responsibilities:

#### Scope of work

- Participation in the development and standardization of briefing material specifically tailored for Member States and other partners.
- Liaise with New York-based Permanent Missions (notably Military Advisors), with regard to TCC contributions and participation in TPP activities, briefings, and events as needed.

- Support the enhanced visibility of the TPP by engaging innovative stakeholders or widening TPP's support.
- Provide subject matter expertise and guidance in areas such as monitoring and evaluation, impact measurement, communication, environmental management, and women, peace and security.
- Timely completion of deliverables for further processing and endorsement by the TPP core team.
- Perform other related duties in the capacity of SME as required.

**Deliverables:**

Implementation of a widened TPP scope of work on monitoring and evaluation, impact assessment, communication, environmental management, or women, peace and security mainstreaming across TPP's work, including research and analysis related to the long-term strategic capacity that TPP can offer in such areas of work.

**Qualification:**

Education: Advanced university degree (master's or equivalent) in conflict, development studies or a related field is required.

**Work Experience:**

The incumbent must be a military officer or an active functional expert within a Member State to the United Nations.

A minimum of five (5) years of progressively responsible experience in monitoring and evaluation, communication, environmental management, gender, diversity, equity, and inclusion, or strategic planning is required.

Experience serving in a United Nations peacekeeping operation or regional organization is desirable.

**Languages:**

English and French are the working languages of the United Nations Secretariat. For this assignment fluency in English is required; knowledge of French is desirable. Knowledge of another official UN language is desirable.

**Assessment Method:**

Evaluation of qualified candidates may include an assessment exercise which may be followed by a competency-based interview.

Appointment will be on a gratis basis meaning that the personnel will be provided to the United Nations by a Member State which will be responsible for the remuneration of the services.
