He started his diplomatic career in 1992 and served in many countries in Europe, Africa and the Near East. Since October 2023, he is the Coordinator for Women Peace and Security, Youth Peace and Security and Mediation Policies at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs in Rome.

From 2013 to 2016, Luca Fratini served as Deputy Permanent Representative to the Rome-based UN Agencies (FAO, IFAD, WFP). From 2017 to 2019, he served – with Ambassador rank – as Deputy Permanent Representative of Italy to the Organization for Security and Co-operation in Europe (OSCE) in Vienna, chairing the Preparatory Committee during the Italian OSCE Chairmanship in 2018.

From 2020 to 2023, Ambassador Fratini held the position of Director of the Office of the OSCE Secretary General in Vienna.

Previously he has held, *inter alia*, the positions of Consul in Locarno (Switzerland); Deputy Ambassador in Harare (Zimbabwe) and Rabat (Morocco); Deputy Head of the Near East Department at the MFA; Head of the Political and Press Office in Paris (France); Ambassador of Italy to Ghana and Togo.

Luca Fratini holds a degree in Economics (*cum laude*) from the LUISS University of Rome. He has been speaker and moderator in a number of international conferences. He is married and has two children.
